COMPOSER SPOTLIGHT

MICHAEL



Mike Conrad is a composer and improviser currently serving as Assistant Professor of Jazz Studies at the University of Northern Iowa. His compositions have earned him four ASCAP Herb Alpert Young Jazz Composer Awards, a SONIC Award from the International Society of Jazz Arrangers & Composers, the 2023 Sammy Nestico Award, and many other accolades. Conrad's music has been performed all over the world, including at Birdland in New York (Count Basie Orchestra feat. Carmen Bradford, 2023), the Midwest Clinic in Chicago (Cedar Falls High School Jazz I, 2022), a 2017 concert by the Metropole Orkest in the Netherlands, and a performance at the US Presidential Inauguration in 2013. Mike Conrad's wide-ranging creative projects include his unique 15-piece group, the All Angles Orchestra (*New Angle*, 2017), the Iowa Jazz Composers Orchestra (*Fertile Soil Suite*, 2021), a reimagination of Beethoven's 3rd symphony in collaboration with the Berlin-based Stegreif

Orchester (2019), and a 2022 trio album release entitled *Reconnect*. He records and performs regionally on piano and trombone with groups like Christopher Merz's "Shorter Stories," the Jon Ailabouni Quintet, Bob Washut's "Emeritet," and the Max Wellman Big Band, and has also performed and recorded with musicians such as Louis Hayes, Alexa Tarantino, and Greg Gisbert. His jazz festival appearances include the Umbria Jazz Festival, the Rochester International Jazz Festival, the Rockport Jazz Festival, the Twin Cities Jazz Festival, and the Iowa City Jazz Festival. Dr. Conrad earned degrees from the University Northern Iowa (BM and BME), the Eastman School of Music (MM), and the University of Northern Colorado (DA). He is in high demand as a clinician and guest director for jazz ensembles, having directed the Iowa All-State Jazz Band (4A) in 2023. FROM THE COMPOSER

"Goodly Creatures" was the first piece I wrote after accepting the job at the University of Northern Iowa in 2018. Chris Merz invited me to compose something for the annual Scholarship Benefit concert to feature myself on piano and trombone as a guest with UNI Jazz Band One.

This piece uses a lot of the musical language associated with the ECM record label, drawing inspiration from Kenny Wheeler in particular. Keith Jarret's "Questar" is a good reference for the overall style/feel of the piece. At the end, a gospel feeling emerges, with Jack Ashford-style tambourine adding an important and groovy layer. A mature rhythm section is required to pull this off. For the horns, the lines should be very legato throughout. When in doubt, add slurs all over the place and tongue less!

The pianist is the primary featured soloist with some rubato space out front, but there is some trading for trombone 2 and tenor 2 later in the chart. The F phrygian scale works well over the first two chords of the progression (Gbmaj7#11 and F7susb9).

"Goodly Creatures" has been performed by UNI Jazz Band One, Cedar Rapids Washington Revolutionists, Muscatine High School Jazz Ensemble, Waukee High School Jazz I, and the Blair Big Band at Vanderbilt University. In addition to the UNI Jazz Band One recording on *Vibrant Lights* (2019), I eventually made a trio version of the tune which was released on my 2022 album *Reconnect*, featuring Katie Ernst and Cassius Goens III.
